Prefixes and Suffixes Prefixes and suffixes are grammatical “affixes” (prefixes come before the root word, and suffixes come after) In very simplistic terms, prefixes change the meaning of words, and suffixes change their form (including plural, tense, comparative, and part of speech) Prefixes - Change the Meaning of Words

Word Decoding- Root words, Prefixes, Suffixes, and Phonics

It is a group of letters you can add to the end of a root word* eg walking, helpful *A root word stands on its own as a word, but you can make new words from it by adding beginnings (prefixes) and endings (suffixes) For example, 'comfort' is a root word By adding the prefix 'dis' and the suffix 'able' you can make new words such as
